

Each of these **S**teps is a necessary component for a functional population health program. This framework allows for the creation of functional programs that will be measurable and impact your target population.

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Our Recent Work

Universities are one of the areas we continue to support during the COVID Pandemic. The new Delta variant has thrown a twist into efforts to reopen during the fall. Most had planned to allow for a full reopening and were anticipating no mask requirements, social distancing or activity limits. Much of this was predicated on an anticipated high vaccination rate of students, faculty and staff and continued low numbers of infections in the community and around the world.



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addition to pushing for vaccinations, are alternate plans that include some forms of Non Pharmaceutical Interventions such as mandatory mask wearing indoors in groups, limiting numbers indoors, ongoing testing of non vaccinated and symptomatic persons, better air handling, etc. Again all while continuing to encouragemore people to become vaccinated.

We anticipate some communities will implement mandatory restrictions and healthcare facilities, universities and others are moving towards mandatory vaccines. The idea of a Vaccine Passport is also getting further support.

A PopHealth Insight!

Lets talk about **Survey**. This step of the Sycle is interrelated with the next 4 and they must be considered as a group. There are a number of key points to consider:

- Setting up your initial measures will affect what results you can report out in the **Score** section. If you don't have initial measures, how will you show improvements in that area?
- What data sets will you use to gather the data? How complete and good are the data? These impacts all the steps.
- What measures are relevant for the population, condition, disease? These impact the **Segment**, **Solve** and **Score** steps.
- What measures can your program target and impact, or which ones can drive program decision making? This impacts the Segment and Solve step.
- In the case of diseases and conditions are their treatment guidelines, USPSTF standards? These impact the Segment, Solve and Score steps.
- Are you measuring Readiness to Change, persona's? These impact the

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more people measure the HgbA1c, but did the values (outcomes) improve?

- What about Health Literacy? This impacts the Segment, Sell and Solve steps
- Are their behavioral or brain health issues associated with people living with this disease? These impact all the steps.

These questions are just a few of the myriad one must answer and some of the relationships to consider before establishing an adequate **Survey** plan for your population.



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
